Fund Raising Starts

Work has now started in earnest to raise money for the Memorial Hall renewal. A magnificent Harvest Festival organised by the Toad Hall regulars made a contribution of £527 to kickstart the appeal.

This was followed by a further £100.

This was followed by a further £100 when Moorsholm was runner-up in the Calor Village of the Year competition, winning a cheque for £200 which the Hall shared with the Village Forum.

Adding to this the £3000 that the Hall Committee had earmarked from their capital reserves, and the Renewal Fund can truly be said to be underway.

But it must be admitted that this is a drop in the ocean compared to the total which will eventually be needed. That amount won't be known until all the plans are drawn up, so constant fund raising will be needed over the next few years.

Development News

The Development Team, led by Helen Beadnall, Jayne Payne and Ian Solomon, are researching possible grant aid to get a detailed Feasibility Study carried out by professional architects & surveyors. This is the next stage from the Options Appraisal Report which was presented to the public meeting earlier this year.

Two sets of drawings will be made — one for a complete rebuild (the preferred option from the public meeting) and the other for a quality refurbishment (necessary so that we can target a range of funders).

This Study will cost around £10,000, and will identify the practical aspects of the options open to us — possible layouts for the building (both on the same footprint, and elsewhere on the site), and how it could be built and maintained in as 'green' as way as possible.

The Study results will be discussed by the Management Committee, and (when approved by them) offered for discussion by the community, before being used to approach the major funders. This will not be a quick job, and we will have to be flexible to meet any changing emphasis in funding.
