Development News

After the earlier setback with the Awards For All grant, there is some better news to report. Ian Solomon has successfully applied for assistance from the Tees Valley Professional Services Group to employ an architect to draw up draft plans for a possible building design. This would allow us to approach the Planning Department for guidance, and subsequently form the basis for a grant application to help fund the building itself.

An initial site meeting was encouraging, although the shape and size of the site do bring problems which complicate matters. However, it's hoped that very shortly the Memorial Hall Committee will be able to discuss one or two concrete proposals, which will then be taken forward to the next stage.

But to allay any fears anyone may have, before any irrevocable decisions are made there will be an opportunity for the people of Moorsholm to view the proposals, and comment on them. The Committee are determined that whatever is finally decided will be welcomed by Moorsholm villagers, so that they can continue to enjoy the benefit of their community hall for decades to come.
