We 're going to need a considerably bigger thermometer! Hall wins LEADER Funding

The money has come from EU Funds, designed to boost social development in rural areas — in our case it was to make the Hall more attractive to a wider range of users. We must add \pounds 8-thousand from the Renewal Fund.

The funding application was made by a small sub-committee, led by Ian Solomon. They must be congratulated for their dogged unravelling of the necessary paperwork.

Work will start very shortly, and it will be necessary to close the Hall for a while so the builders can get on site to carry out the work.

We're delighted to report that he was given superb care at JCH and is now home again... but taking it easy for a while. We all wish him well.

The LEADER has Landed

The granting of the LEADER Funding is wonderful news — but like all such things, it's only now that the work really starts. Now we have to make the proposals come into being.

And in this there are some awkward time constraints, imposed as much as anything on the North Yorkshire CC (who administer the grants) by the EU (who supply the money). Recent moving of goal-posts mean that we need to make a valiant attempt to get the major part of the work done by December 31st. This will clearly be very difficult, but we must at least try.

Our contractors — Harvey Walby for the building work and Plumb-Lec (Peter Thompson) for the heating and plumbing — will be making a start as soon as possible, once we have cleared certain important bookings in the remainder of this month. We will then **close the Hall down** completely, so that the contractors can work safely and unhindered. We can't be sure how long this will take, but it will certainly be a couple of months, as we intend to redecorate the building afterwards to complete the transformation.

Some regular bookings (surgery, WI, Keep Fit) may be able to transfer to the Church Hall, but others (badminton, bowls, dinners and parties) will regrettably have to be suspended. A major casualty of this will be the annual Christmas Dinner, scheduled for December 5th. If you've already bought tickets, Pete Smith will be in touch with you. We anticipate some sort of replacement celebration will take place when the refurbishment is complete.

MoorsholmLIVE's Vin Garbutt evening on November 29th will go ahead — and will be the last major event in the Hall in its current guise. Their first 2010 gig (see P4) will be the wonderful New Rope String Band on March 19th, and it's hard to imagine a more lively group to kick off the new season in a renewed building.

But let's make one thing very plain — although our Page 1 thermometer appears to have burst, it will be back in the New Year at a much lower level. The improvements will be significant, but they will take up almost all the Renewal Fund money. So this will not be the end of the Committee's ambitions to make the Hall an attractive, warm and welcoming place. We will continue to fund-raise for other improvements, such as better thermal efficiency and an improved car park



surface. But these have the advantage of being treatable as separate 'target' projects that we can concentrate on individually. Indeed, various events are already in the planning stage for next year, including a Fashion Show, Dalesmen Singers concert, Treasure Hunt Supper and a Coffee Morning.

We must also remember why we have been given this funding. LEADER is an EUwide project to improve disadvantaged rural areas, and in particular it aims to widen the opportunities for communities to prosper and develop. We haven't been given the grant purely to make the Hall a nicer place — we have been given the grant to encourage new activities to take place which will improve community life... and one way to do that is to make the Hall a nicer place.

The difference is subtle, but important. The grant was made on the basis of the Village Survey carried out some time ago, in which Moorsholm residents said that certain new activities were needed in the village — a Youth Club, Parent & Toddler Group, Pensioners' Drop-in Centre were some of the ideas put forward. Once the Hall is turned into an attractive venue for those activities, we need to make them happen... or Brussels might want its money back!

Once the dust has settled, the Committee will be making a big effort to encourage such activities to start... but they will not be running them themselves. Their brief is only to provide an attractive venue for a range of new activities, and will be looking to volunteers or other outside agencies to organise them.

But as we approach the refurbished Hall, we thank everyone in and around Moorsholm for your enthusiastic fund-raising support.
