# Much Admired

But we're not finished yet — there's still work to be done to improve the insulation, stop the draughts in the Entrance Hall, and replace the leaky guttering. So the thermometer must continue to rise, and we thank everyone who's contributed in any way.

The 200 Club for this year raised £1460, half of which goes into the prize fund, and the other half into the Renewal account. The Dalesmen Singers concert brought in £513, while the Easter Coffee Morning raised £217.

The Moorsholm In Bloom Coffee Morning (when the refurbished Hall was unveiled) was very successful for them, so they gave a  $\pm 50$  donation to the Hall — thanks.

As many of you will know, Tom Youngman from Back Lane Farm died recently, and a collection (amount to be confirmed) was taken at his funeral service in aid of the Renewal Fund.

All these donations and fund-raising are much appreciated by the Committee.

#### New Memorial Hall Chairman

At the annual General Meeting in March, Ken Richardson stepped down as Chairman, needing to continue to take it easy since his heart scare. The Committee thanked him for the work he had done as Chairman, and warmly welcomed Ian Solomon, who agreed to stand for election in his place.
